

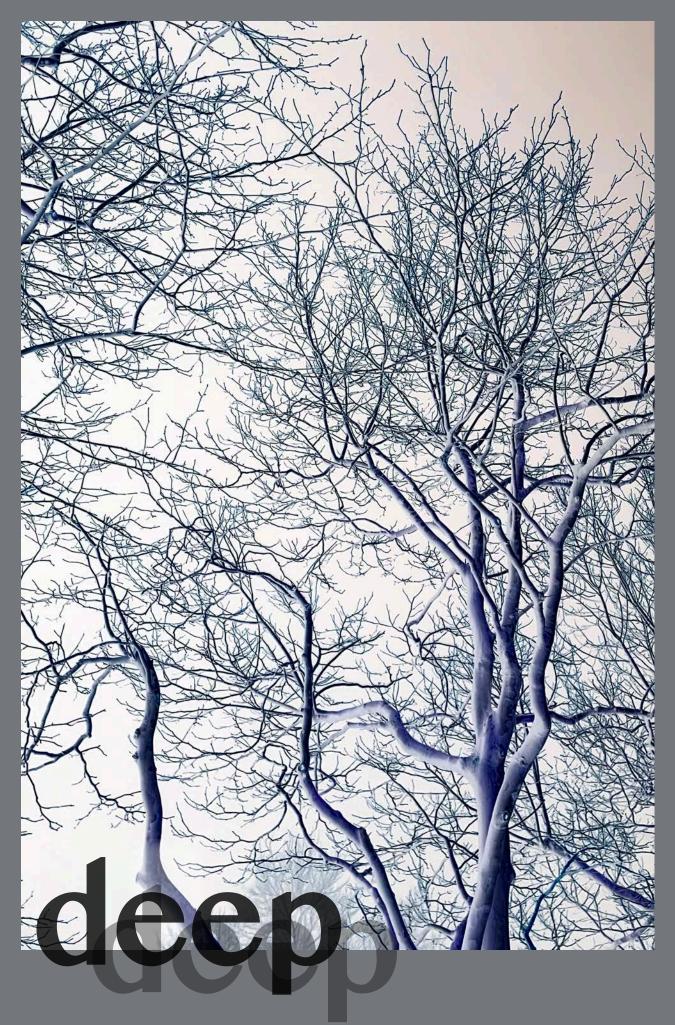
## deep real ease

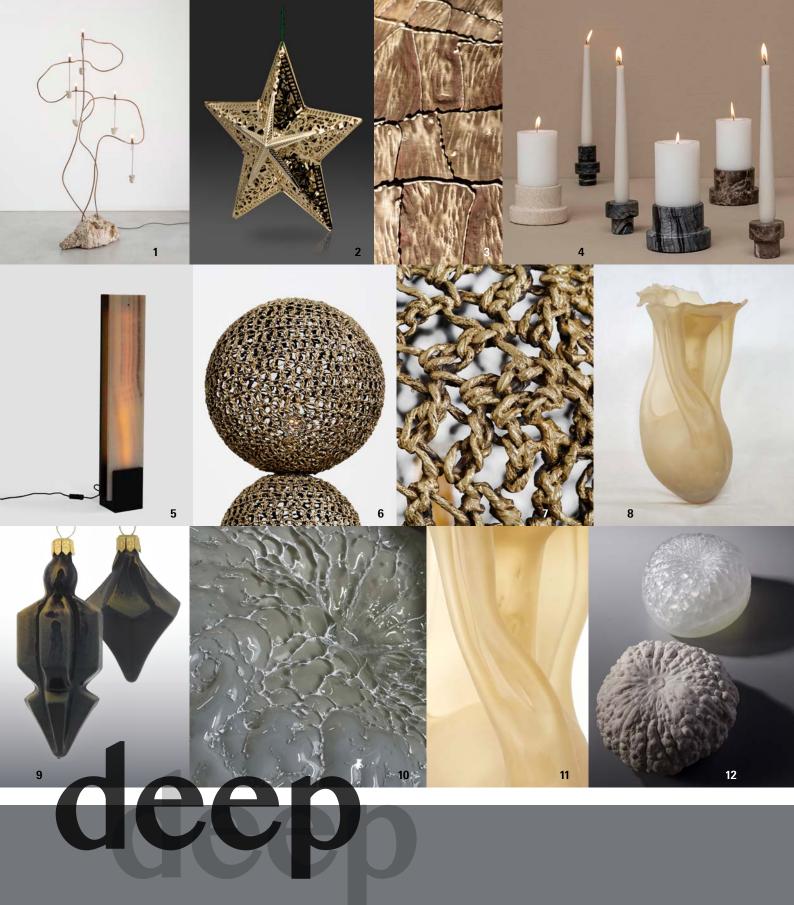

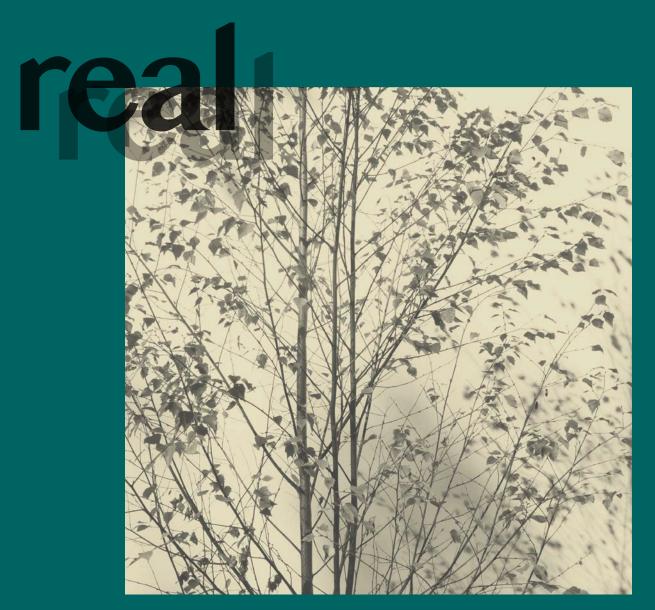

**Colours** A palette of high sensitivity and colours that occur unadulterated in nature supports introspection. Familiar colours like night sky, for example, or egg shell ecru. Alabaster white with its warm, calm radiance fits in with this character. Darker metallic nuances are also important, matt silver or subtle gold, which reflect the light magnificently through cleverly structured surfaces and provide a festive shimmer. At the same time, the colours and light-infused surfaces help to create that reverent spiritual depth that allows the moment to be experienced as something special.





The desire to help shape a more sustainable future is growing. Research is ongoing into new visions for designs, materials and techniques that are developed for their positive influence over the environment, society and individuals. **real** is where these optimistic efforts produce fascinating results. Festive celebrations highlight the importance of intergenerational responsibility and a hope for affirmative steps forward.

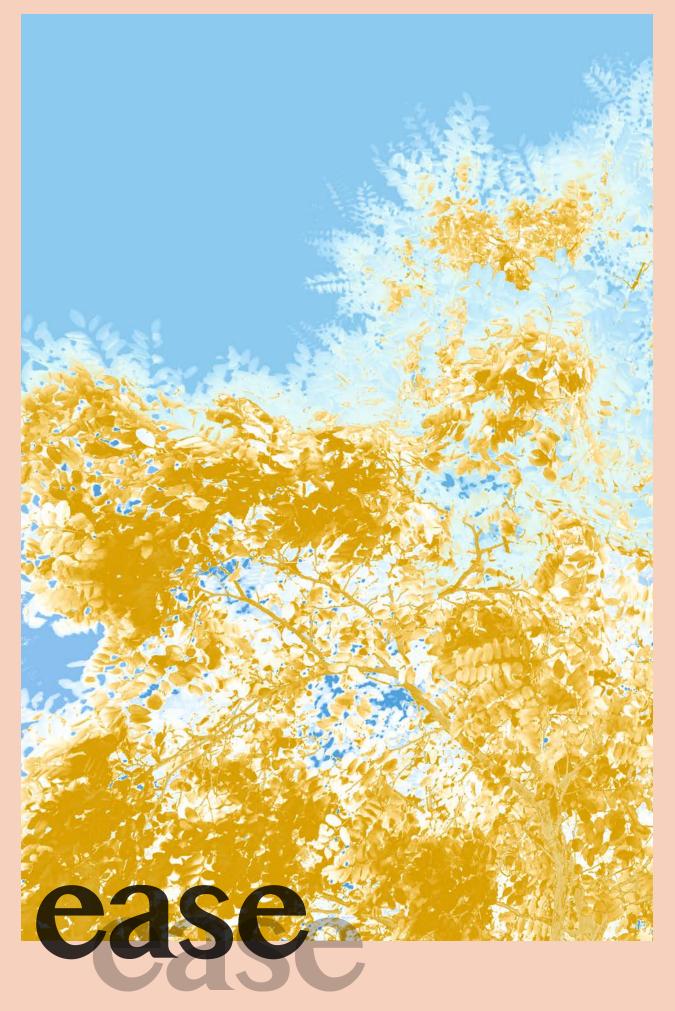
The essence of sustainability is durability – and this is a great place for designers to start. Both items' ease of practical use and their suitability for environmentally-sound circularity are becoming more important. Everything points towards improvements. Minimalist shapes fit in with a modern lifestyle that stands for sustainable values and an outstanding demand for quality. Industrial design contributes high-quality ideas and aesthetics that cleverly reinterpret familiar ways of using and viewing objects. Original ideas leave convention behind, underlining the unobtrusive emotion in items like tree decorations. Digital technologies also offer expressive, tactile surfaces that appear handmade. High-value waste products such as those from traditional glassmaking play a major role, being made into new aesthetic items in line with resource-saving principles. A key feature of some baubles and decorations turned from Swiss pine really does the soul good: their fragrance.



**Colours** The balanced colour palette combines strength and balance. Individual colours are associated with durability and authenticity, both also reflected in objects' design. Colour coverage is not so wide, with the materials instead appearing luminous and transparent. Some of the colours also send a special message. Christmassy green symbolises growth and fresh hope, while the shades of precious wood supply a soft, less-intense beige as a connection to the soil. The ideas of sustainability and environmental awareness find their true expression here. These colours find fitting counterparts in emotional aspects such as love and attention. Effects like these are reliable components of festive styles, and other meaningful designs also employ this effect.

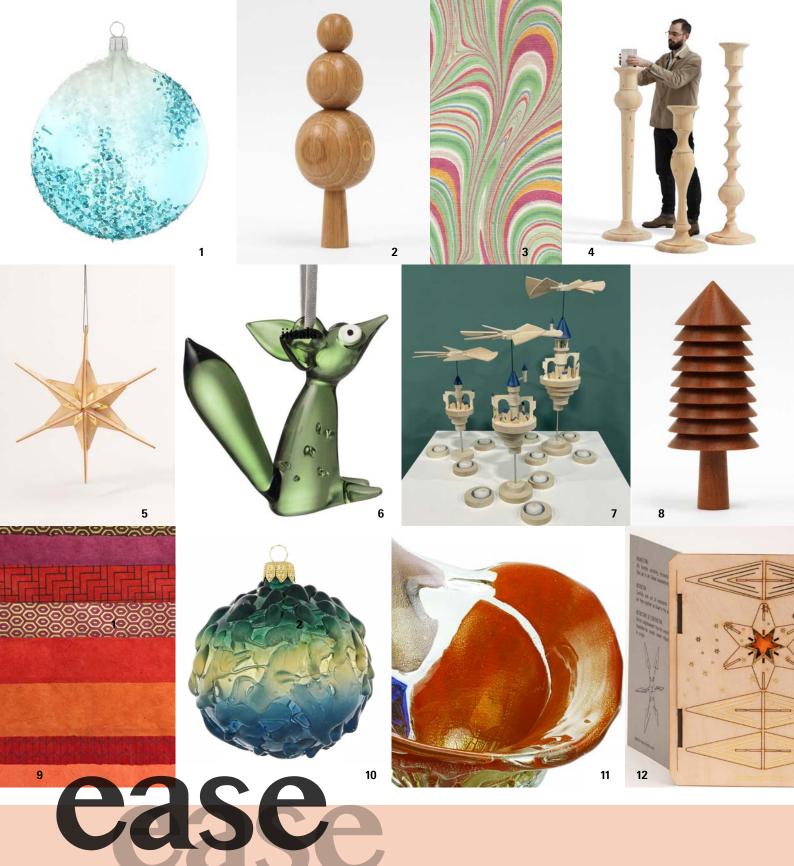
